WHY CHOOSE US?

At Hartford Manor, we truly believe that your child's learning journey begins in Nursery. We foster each child's love of learning through discovery, challenge and adventure.

We offer the children opportunities to develop their skills in all areas of the Foundation Stage Curriculum. We do this through carefully planned topics and with sessions based around quality children's stories, seasonal changes, celebrations and festivals, and children's interests.

We also foster your child's independence through supportive relationships and meeting everyone's individual needs.

With a focus on each child, we work alongside other professionals to ensure they achieve their potential and leave Nursery ready for their next step in learning.

Being part of the whole school means that children who continue their learning journey at Hartford Manor are familiar and confident with routines, have met the Reception team and feel settled and ready to move on.

FREE NURSERY PLACES

Three and four-year olds are entitled to up to 30 hours of free early years education depending on eligibility. All funding - 30 and 15 hours - becomes available the term after a child's third birthday:

Autumn Term - 1st September to 31st December

Spring Term - 1st January to 31st March

Summer Term - 1st April to 31st August

All children in England get 570 free hours per year. This is usually taken as 5 three hour sessions each week for 38 weeks. Parents may also choose to pay for additional sessions.

From September 2017, families may also be eligible for up to 30 hours free childcare if parents are:

- in work - or getting parental leave, sick leave or annual leave;
- earning at least the National Minimum/Living Wage for 16 hours a week - this equates to £120 if you are over 25

If you are not working, you may still be eligible if your partner is working, and you get Incapacity Benefit, Severe Disablement Allowance, Carer's Allowance or Employment and Support Allowance.

You cannot get 30 hours free childcare if you earn £100,000 or more.

FEES

We offer 15 hour funded places for all children between the ages of 3 and 4 years. We also offer up to 30 hour places for eligible children.

Morning Session: 8.40am – 11.40am

Lunch: 11.40am – 12.20pm

Afternoon Session: 12.20pm – 3.20pm

If you choose to use some, or all, of your funded sessions as full days we charge £2.50 to cover the 40 minute lunchtime session. If required, we also offer a school meal priced at £2.30.

If you wish to book sessions in addition to your funded hours, our fees are:

Session	Time	Fees
Morning – 3hrs	8.40am – 11.40am	£12
Afternoon – 3 hrs	12.20pm – 15.20pm	£12

Extended sessions and full days

We also offer the added flexibility of additional full days and extended sessions in the morning and afternoon to include lunch. Where extended sessions are added onto a funded morning or afternoon place we charge £2.50 to cover the 40 minute lunchtime period.

Our fees for non-funded sessions are £14.50 for a morning or afternoon session including lunchtime and £26.50 for a full day – plus meal price.

Breakfast and After School Clubs

Our Breakfast Club is available from 7.30am to 8.40am and costs £3.50 per day. Children are escorted to Nursery by the Breakfast Club team.

Our After School Club runs until 6pm each day. The club costs £9 with a snack or £10 with a light meal. We also offer an early pick up rate of £5 per day for children collected by 4.15pm. Children are collected from Nursery by the After School Club team each day.

Nursery fees can be paid via childcare vouchers/tax free childcare. School meal charges must be paid for online via ParentPay.

OUR FACILITIES

The Nursery area is located within the main school building as part of Foundation Stage. Alongside Reception class children, we have our own secure area of the school. We share the enclosed outdoor space, which includes a grass area, playground and soft surface area. Nursery staff plan and design appropriate activities to meet the children's learning needs. We encourage our Nursery and Reception children to learn and play together and they often enjoy completing activities as teams.

The Nursery room is organised into different activity areas including block play, story-telling, role play house, 'messy play' and a reading corner.

Health, Safety and Security

Keeping our children safe is a key priority. Throughout the day, all visitors use the main school entrance via the secure camera phone system. Whilst on our premises, all visitors must display our Visitor Badges.

There are no direct access routes to other areas of the school through the Foundation Stage. During morning arrival time, a member of staff is on every door to greet children and their parents, to ensure that all children are safe. Our 'finger safe' doors are closed once the school day starts and can only be opened by a member of staff.

Our classroom and outdoor area risk assessments are reviewed regularly by staff and our Site Manager.

Food and Nutrition

We encourage children to make healthy choices at school. At snack time, we offer at least two choices of fruit and either water or milk. Our school meals follow strict guidelines and operate a 'No Nuts' policy in the kitchen. We are happy to work with parents of children with any dietary needs/allergies to ensure their well-being.

OTHER USEFUL INFORMATION

Snack

A healthy snack of fresh fruit and a drink of milk or water is provided free of charge during each morning session.

We operate a rolling snack system, where a bell is rung to signal the start of snack time; children can then come when they are ready, leaving time to finish an activity without disturbing their concentration.

Water is available for the children to drink throughout the day.

Lunchtimes

If your child is staying at Nursery for lunchtime, they can bring a packed lunch from home or choose a school meal. Menus are set out in our weekly newsletter and also available on our website. Meals are ordered from the school kitchen daily so you can choose the combination of packed lunches and school meals that suits you and your child.

Uniform

We encourage Nursery children to wear our uniform. But they are welcome to wear their own clothes if you prefer.

Toileting

The Nursery is well equipped with specially designed, low level toilets and washbasins to make it as easy as possible for children to be independent. We also have toilet steps if required.

The children are free to use the toilet whenever they need to and will be supported when required.

For those children who still wear nappies or pull-ups, we ask parents to provide a small bag containing nappies and wipes. We do not charge for additional supplies - nappy sacks, staff gloves/aprons, disposing of waste.

AWARDS AND ACCREDITATIONS

- Safeguarding: All members of the Nursery team have Level 1 Safeguarding training.
- Paediatric First Aid.
- Primary Writing Project – We have been a Talk for Writing school since 2014. Stories and books that form part of our topics are taken from the whole school Literature Spine.
- LEN's Project - We are contributors to the Liverpool Early Numeracy Skills Research project. Working alongside Liverpool John Moores University, we have been developing our maths teaching and resources alongside a research study that will track our children until they are 7 years old.
- Makaton – Using signs/actions and symbols children are supported to communicate meaningfully and effectively whilst developing speech.
- WELLCOMM – Helping to identify and support potential language and speech difficulties and provide intervention where necessary.



A DAY IN THE LIFE OF 'ROBERT'

Robert attends 15 hours at Hartford Manor spread over 5 mornings per week – 8.40am to 11.40am

8.40am – Mummy or grandma bring me to Nursery and help me to hang my coat and bag on my peg. I choose an activity to do whilst everyone arrives.

9.00am – We all sit together on the carpet, say 'Good Morning' to each other and share our news. We always have a story to share and talk about.

9.20am – Sometimes we work in smaller groups with one of the grown-ups, sometimes I choose somewhere to 'play & learn' and a grown-up will join in with what I am doing.

10.00am – The snack time bell rings and if I am hungry or I have finished working with a grown up, I wash my hands and choose what fruit I would like from the snack basket. I always try to open or peel the fruit by myself but if I can't a grown up is there to help me.

10.15am – The outdoor area is open for play and learning. If I want to go outside I can get my coat, sunhat or wellies and go outside. There is always a grown up outside to learn with me.

11.15am – It's Phonics time! We work in groups to learn new letters, listen for sounds and play rhyming games.

11.30am – I say 'Goodbye' to my friends that are staying at Nursery then I get my home time things and we go to meet mummy at the gate.



A DAY IN THE LIFE OF 'SAVANNA'

Savanna attends 30 hours at Hartford Manor per week.

Each day 8.40am – 3.20pm including lunch

8.40am – Sometimes I go to Breakfast Club. I have toast and cereal. A grown up takes me to Nursery when it's time.

11.40am – After we have said goodbye to our friends in Breakfast Club, we share a story and sing songs. If it has been rainy; we do '5-a-day' or 'Jump Start Johnny'. It's good exercise!

11.50am – We go to the toilet and wash our hands ready for lunchtime. Sometimes I bring a packed lunch and sometimes I have a school dinner. A grown up helps us to cut up food and to open any tricky packets in our lunchboxes. They're really good at showing us how to use a knife and fork. Sometimes we get lunchtime stickers for trying something new or clearing our plates!

12.20pm – When all my friends have finished eating we come back into Nursery and choose a quieter activity to do like sharing books, jigsaw puzzles or drawing. Sometimes friends go home after lunch and some new friends arrive.

1.00pm – We start our afternoon together on the carpet. We might be busy counting, looking at shapes or measuring.

1.20pm - Sometimes we work in smaller groups with one of the grown-ups, sometimes I choose somewhere to play and learn and a grown-up will join in with me. We might choose to go outside too.

3.00pm – I get my home time things and we share a story until our parents arrive or a grown up collects us for After School Club.
