Dear Parents and Carers,

This week, the children in Years 2-6 had a visit from Redrow construction company to talk to them about safety near building sites. They explained how to stay safe around construction vehicles and hazards to be aware of if they are ever on a building site. Redrow kindly donated hi-vis jackets for the children to use on school outings.

Our school council meet regularly to discuss issues and concerns raised by the other children so that changes can be made.
